Sports Premium Allocation 2013 - 2014

Context:

In April 2013, the Department for Education announced new funding of £150 million to support the delivery of PE and school sport until 2016 and became effective in September 2013. Prime Minister, David Cameron has since announced that the Government will commit further funding equalling £750 million to 2020. This is being allocated to all state-maintained secondary, primary, middle and special schools. Hartsbourne received £8,000 plus £5 per pupil based on our Jan 13 census of children aged 5-11 years of age – a total of £8,870 between September 2013 and August 2014.

We are using our Sport Premium to improve the quality of PE and Sport provision in the following ways:

- Procuring quality assured professional training for staff to raise their confidence and competence in teaching PE and sport.
- Hiring professional sports coaches to teach the children different sports during curriculum time.
- Supporting regular sport tournaments, festivals and competitions for pupils of all ages.
- Free of Charge after school clubs such as multisport and table tennis.

All of the above will motivate, engage and challenge our children in PE.

Overview: 2013-2014:

In September 2013 Hartsbourne received £5,422 of PE and Sports Funding. We spent £1,500 participating in the Watford and Hertsmere School Sports Partnership. This scheme enhances the provision of PE and sport by way of professional development, competition, and leadership.

We purchased a circular table tennis table which will be used to offer a free of charge after school club, introducing the children to a sport not taught at Hartsbourne before. This may lead to participation in inter-school table tennis tournaments.

From March this year, Premier Sport offered a multisport after-school club for KS1 and 2 giving the children confidence and competences to take part in physical activity. A qualified coach has led PE sessions for Y3/4/5 and a structured lunchtime club for KS1. In total £2,025 has been spent on extra sports sessions and equipment so far. Year 5 participated in the Arsenal/Hertsmere Community Outreach Programme delivering PE and Literacy in schools. In July this year Years 5 & 6 children will also have the opportunity to trial for a place in Hertsmere's Athletics, Basketball and Kwik Cricket teams for the 2014 Herts Youth Games.

Further funding of £3,448 in May this year will enable Hartsbourne to continue to pursue new initiatives and we are privileged to have a Paralympics discus thrower visit our school during the summer term whose inspirational talk will aim to engage the least active, vulnerable and under achieving pupils in physical activity. During June and July 2014 Children in Year 4 will benefit from an activity day at Cufley Camp, participating in fire building, archery and assault courses and Year 6 will take part in a cycle training week both of which will cost over £700.

Summary:

At Hartsbourne Primary School, we are committed to building on successful practice. The Governing Body and staff will continue to monitor, evaluate and review the impact of the school's PE and sport provision, ensuring the funding is being used effectively in encouraging children to develop healthy lifestyles and reach performance levels of which they are capable.
